

NEW DELHI, Aug 14 (ANI)

## Scientists find effects of climate change on WAYANAD LANDSLIDES

NEW DELHI, Aug 14 (PTI)

THE deadly landslides in Kerala's ecologically fragile Wayanaddistrict were triggered by a heavy burst of rainfall, made 10 per cent heavier by climate change, according to a new rapid attribution study by a global team of scientists.

The team of 24 researchers from India, Sweden, the US and the UK said that more than 140 mm of rainfall fell in a single day on soils highly saturated by two months of monsoon precipitation, triggering catastrophic landslides and floods that killed at least 231 people in Wayanad.

"The rainfall that triggered the landslides occurred in a region of Wayanad that has the highest landslide risk in the State. Even heavier downpours are expected as the climate warms, which underscores the urgency to prepare for similar landslides in northern Kerala," Maja Vahlberg, a climate risk consultant at the Red Cross Red Crescent Climate Centre, said.

## CM announces Rs 6 lakh aid to kin of deceased

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM, Aug 14 (PTI)

KERALA Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan on Wednesday announced a compensation of Rs sixlakh to the next of kin of those who died in the massive landslides that hit Wayanad district recently and claimed over 200 lives.

Vijayan said that of the Rs six lakh, Rs four lakh wouldcome from the State Disaster Relief Fund and the remaining from the Chief Minister's Disaster Relief Fund. He also announced that Rs 75,000 would be allocated from the CMDRF to those who lost eyes and limbs or suffered disability up to 60 per cent in the landslides.

Army Captain DEEPAK SINGH killed in Doda action

JAMMU, Aug 14 (PTI)

AN ARMY Captain was killed and four terrorists were believed to be gunned down in an ongoing operation in the higher reaches of Jammu region's Doda district on Wednesday, officials said.

A civilian was also injured in the encounter that broke out a day ahead of Independence Day and is the latest in a series of incidents in Jammu region that has witnessed a spike in violence.

Bullets rang out on Wednesday morning in a thickly forested area during a cordon and search operation (CASO) launched by a joint team to track down a group of foreign terrorists hiding in the Shivgarh-Assar belt, officials said. Captain Deepak Singh (Contd on page 4)
