WAQF BILL Panel meets Muslim bodies

NEW DELHI, Aug 30 (PTI)

A MEETING of the joint committee of Parliament on the Waqf (Amendment) Bill on Friday witnessed fireworks with members vociferously opposing certain provisions of the draft legislation, leading to a brief walkout by Opposition members.

The panel, chaired by BJP member Jagadambika Pal, heard the views of All India Sunni Jamiyatul Ulama of Mumbai, Delhi-based Indian Muslims for Civil Rights (IMCR), Uttar Pradesh Sunni Waqf Board and Rajasthan Board of Muslim Waqf during the day-long sitting lasting nearly eight hours.

The main bone of contention were the provisions of 'declaration of Waqf by user', designation of District Collector as the primary authority indetermining the classification of


Doval meets SL President and other leaders for political consultations

NATIONAL Security Advisor Ajit Doval on Friday held wideranging political consultations with President Ranil Wickremesinghe and other Sri Lankan leaders here ahead of the presidential election on September 21.

Doval, who is here to follow up on the ongoing Colombo Security Conclave (CSC) initiative, met Wickremesinghe, Prime Minister Dinesh Gunwardena, the main Opposition leader Sajith Premadasa and the Marxist JVP leader Anura Kumara Dissanayake.

All, barring Gunawardena, are presidential candidate front runners. During the meeting with Wickremesinghe at the Presidential Secretariat, they discussed ongoing economic collaboration between Sri

Colombo Security Conclave signs Charter and MoU for Secretariat

COLOMBO, Aug 30 (PTI)

NATIONAL Security Advisor Ajit Doval and the representatives of the Maldives, Mauritius and Sri Lanka on Friday signed the Charter and an MoU for the establishment of the Colombo Security Conclave Secretariat here to promote regional security by addressing transnational threats and challenges of common concern to the member states. The Colombo Security Conclave (CSC) brings together National Security Advisors (NSA) and Deputy NSAs from India, Sri Lanka, Maldives and Mauritius. It deals with maritime security, counter-terrorism and cyber security with India bringing to the fore its own strategic concerns in the Indian Ocean and promotes regional security by addressing transnational threats and challenges of common concern to the Member States.

"Pursuant to the discussions at the 6th NSA level meeting of CSC held in December 2023 in Mauritius, the Charter & MoU for the establishment of the CSC Secretariat were signed in Colombo on August 30, 2024 by India, Maldives, Mauritius and Sri Lanka", the Indian High Commission here said. "Doval highlighted the significance of the Founding Documents to further bolster CSC's pivotal role in ensuring regional security and stability. "Emphasising the role of CSC in ensuring sustained engagement across diverse pillars of cooperation, he (Doval) stressed the importance of collective efforts in addressing traditional, non-traditional, and emerging hybrid challenges in the Indian Ocean Region," the High Commission added.

Manipur can't be broken: 6M

NEW DELHI, Aug 30 (PTI)

MANIPUR Chief Minister N Biren Singh has emphatically

rejected the demand by Kuki groups for a separate administration, presenting himself as a champion of the State's interest and one who will not allow its identity to be diluted.

In an interview to PTI Videos on Thursday, he described Manipur as a small, hardworking State and said "our forefathers" have a history of 2,000 years. "Many sacrifices were made to make this State. This State can't be broken or have a separate administration. We will not allow this," the Chief Minister stated. This is the first unequivocal rejection of the demand by

Kukis. At a press conference on Thursday in New Delhi, some representatives of Kuki-zo communities demanded the

> creation of a Union Territory with a legislature along the lines of Puducherry, arguing that it is the only way out of strife.

Singh, a Meitei accused by Kukis of siding with his community in the ethnic violence

which erupted in May last year and polarised Manipur society like never before, has, however, expressed his support for a special development package for the State's hilly region where Kukis live.

"We can look at what can be done through the autonomous councils (present in hill districts) with focus on development," he said.
