# SC rejects return to ballots, says distrust of EVMs 'blind'

for return to the paper ballot system as "foible and unsound" and rejected the prayer for giving voters physical access to VVPAT slips, and for 100% counting of paper slips.

The court was unequivocal in attesting to the integrity of EVMs, saying the possibility of hacking or tampering was unfounded. "...The suspicion that EVMs can be configured/manipulated for repeated or wrong recording of vote(s) to

- SC directs symbol loading units (SLUs)

Unless substantial evidence is presented against EVMs, the current system will have to persist with enhancements. Regressive measures to revert to paper ballots or any alternative to EVMs that do not adequately safeguard interests of Indian citizens have to be eschewed Repeated and persistent doubts and despair, even without supporting evidence, can have the contrarian impact of creating distrust.

favour a particular candidate should be rejected," it said.

A bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna and Dipankar Datta, however, passed directions to further strengthen the integrity of the system and said like EVMs, symbol loading units shall be sealed and secured after symbols have been loaded in VVPAT (Voter Verifiable Paper Audit Trail) machines.

## Tight slap for oppn, says PM; VVPAT fight continues: Cong

M Modi Friday said the SC verdict was a "tight slap" to the Congress-led opposition which must "apologise" for creating distrust against EVMs. Addressing rallies in Bihar, Modi said EVMs ended the opposition's game of booth capturing, so they "com-

mitted the sin" of sowing doubts about EVMs.

Responding to the PM's attack, Congress said it was "not a party, directly or indirectly" to the pleas in SC, but added that its "campaign on greater use of VVPATs to increase public trust" will continue". P14

## Water storage in key S India reservoirs at 17%

New Delhi: Looming water shortage continues to stare at southern India as level of storage of 42 key reservoirs in five states - Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka, Kerala and Tamil Nadu-has collectively reduced to 17% of the reservoir capacity, bringing the level to lower than the storage during the corresponding period last year. Individually, Kerala's reservoirs have, however, better storage than last year.

Data released by the Central Water Commission (CWC) shows that these reservoirs had 8.8 billion cubic meters (BCM) of water as on Thursday (April 25) against a total storage capacity of 53.3 BCM.

The storage during the corresponding period of last year was 29% of total capacity whereas average storage of the last 10 years during corresponding period was 23% of the total live storage capacity of these reservoirs.

Thus, storage during current year (17% of total capacity) is less than the storage of corresponding period of

last year and is also less than the average storage of last ten years during the corresponding period," said a weekly bulletin on status of the country's 150 key reservoirs, spread over five regions, monitored by the CWC.

Though water level in reservoirs of

other regions, except the eastern region, too declined compared to the live storage during the corresponding period last year, reservoirs in the southern region showed the steepest fall.

Overall, 150 reservoirs across the country collectively had 53.3 BCM of waters which was 30% of the total live capacity of 178.7 BCM on Thursday, Reduction in water level at this time of the year is, however, not unusual, but its sharp decline this year is quite worrisome as monsoon is still more than a month away from the country's mainland.

"The overall higher decline in reservoirs across India is attributed to below average monsoon rainfall last year. Less monsoon rains means less storage in these reservoirs during the rainy season and more withdrawal of during the post-monsoon phase, both for drinking and irrigation purposes," said an official.

He said the forecast of 'above normal' monsoon rainfall this year would, however, bring relief.

# Will agree to truce if independent Palestinian state established: Hamas

ISTANBUL, Apr 25 (AP)

A TOP Hamas political official told 'The Associated Press' that the Islamic militant group is willing to agree to a truce of five years or more with Israel and that it would lay down its weapons and convert into a political party if an independent Palestinian state is established along pre-1967 borders.

The comments by Khalil al-Hayya in an interview on Wednesday came amid a stalemate in months of talks for a ceasefire in Gaza. The suggestion that Hamas would disarm appeared to be a significant concession by the militant group officially committed to Israel's destruction.

But it's unlikely Israel would consider such a scenario. It has vowed to crush Hamas following the deadly October 7 attacks that triggered the war, and its currentleadership is adamantly opposed to the creation of a Palestinian state on lands Israel captured in the 1967 Mideast war. Al-Hayya, a high-ranking Hamas official who has represented the Palestinian militants in negotiations for a ceasefire and hostage exchange, struck a sometimes defiant and other times conciliatory tone.

Al-Hayya said Hamas wants to join the Palestine Liberation Organisation, headed by the rival Fatah faction.

## Sri Lanka to hand management of China-built airport to India, Russia cos

Colombo: Sri Lanka will hand over management of its \$209 million Chinese-builtairport to two Indian and Russian companies, a cabinet statement said on Friday, as the island nation attempts to reduce losses from its state enterprises. Mattala Rajapaksa International Airport, funded by China EXIM Bank, has stoked controversy since its opening in 2013 due to a low number of flights, environmentally sensitive location and persistent financial losses.

The airport's management will be handed over to Shaurya Aeronautics (Pvt) Ltd. of India and Airports of Regions Management Company of Russia for 30 years, a cabinet statement said, without mentioning the deal value.

Sri Lanka is negotiating with China EXIM Bank to restructure the airport loan, part of \$4.2 billion borrowed for other infrastructure projects. The airport was built during the tenure of former president Mahinda Rajapaksa who shifted the country closer to China. REUTERS

## Over 63% turnout in phase-II LS polls

**Highest 79.46%** polling in Tripura Mah records 57.83% voting

NEW DELHI, Apr 26 (PTI)

OVER 63 per cent polling was reported in the second phase of Lok Sabha elections covering 88 seats across 13 States amid few complaints of EVM glitches and bogus voting in some states.

Voters in some villages of Uttar Pradesh's Mathura, Rajasthan's Banswara and Maharashtra's Parbhani were boycotting the polls over various issues but were later persuaded by authorities to cast their franchise.

Polling for the second stage of the seven-phase elections started at 7 am and ended at 6 pm. Several states experienced intense heat conditions. The first phase of polling was held on April 19 in 102 seats across 21 States and Union Territories.

The Election Commission (EC) said polling remained largely peaceful. The tentative figure at 8 pm of voter turnout was 63.50 per cent. It is likely to go upwards when reports from all polling stations are obtained, the EC said, adding voters reaching polling stations

Polling was held in all 20 seats of Kerala, 14 of the 28 seats in Karnataka, 13 seats in Rajasthan, 8 seats each in Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh, 6 seats in Madhya

The India-Pakistan bilateral ties nose-dived and the trade between the two countriesstopped after India abrogated Article 370 of the Constitution, revoking the special status of the State of Jammu and Kashmir and bifurcating into two Union Territories on August 5, 2019.

India has repeatedly told Pakistan that Jammu and Kashmir "was, is and shall forever" remain an integral part of the country.
