India won't rush to ratify lst part of fisheries agreement

Abu Dhabi: Govt is in no rush to ratify first part of the fisheries agreement, arguing that internal consultations are going on, while outlining its concerns over the move to expand scope of the pact here.

While WTO is seeking member nations to ratify the deal that was reached in Geneva in 2022, the response has been slow so far and India is in no mood to oblige even as chief Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala has set a new deadline. Besides, there is growing pressure to expand the scope, which India is resisting, with officials arguing that it is to protect the interest of fisherfolk from poor countries too.

"Comuries have created huge capacities with large vessels, which are not doing livelihood fishing. India is seekingrights over exclusive economiczone (up to 200 nautical miles) as a very important geographical distinction as the livelihood of fishermen depends on that. We are unwilling to give sovereign rights," said an official, while demanding disciplines on distant fishing and other measures to discourage rich nations and others such as China that indulge in deep water fishing.

Swadeshi Jagran Manch co-convener Ashwani Mahajan said countries such as Denmark were offering subsidy in excess of \$75,000 per farmer, which was \$15 in India's case. Civil society groups flagged other concerns too. "Indian fishermen have a history of sustainable fishing. We need to define small fishermen. Climate change has forced our fishermen to go deep. If the agreement is not in our favour it will be detrimental as 60% are below the poverty line. It is important that India puts up a strong resistance," said National Fishworkers' Forum general secretary Olencio Simoes.

Ranja Sengupta from the Third World Network underlined the need for developed countries, such as EU members, need to be disciplined. "The disciplines are not strong enough. India is seeking a long transition period, hope India does not accept anything less than 20 years."

WTO: India to oppose investment agreement

Says It's Not A Trade Issue, US Blocking Dispute Settlement And Remittances

Abu Dhabi: India on Tuesday made it clear that it would oppose any bid by pro-Belt Road Initiative countries to push an investment facilitation agreement at WTO, arguing that it was not a trade issue and was being rushed through when critical subjects, on which the membership had given a mandate more than a decade ago was not being addressed.

Govt has argued that core issues such as reform of the dispute settlement body were blocked by the US, while there were several other areas, including inclusion of remittances where the Biden administration was opposing a deal, despite it being of use to poor and developing nations.

uth Africa are opposing. They are of the view that any such agreement should first be discussed among members, instead of presenting it as a fait accompli as sovereign decisions on investment are involved. Officials said the plurilateral agreement was agreed upon among the 130 members only on Sunday. "First there needs to be consensus at WTO on having an agreement then we can discuss the details, which was not the case with this agreement," an official said. Since 1996, govt has opposed an investment facilitation agreement.

India is worried that provisions of the investment agreement will impact its autonomous policy space and an inclusion into the WTO framework will be used to widen the scope of the agreement. The statement came as 72 countries signed an agreement on domestic regulation of services, which seeks to make rules transparent for grant of visas to doctors and nurses as well as licenses for telecom companies and banks. India, however, does not have to take any commitments to align its regulations with the agreement.

Officials said the agreement is lower than the ambition set by India for services reform, which was being ignored by developed countries, given that India was very competitive in the sector, be it professionals or sector

Bengaluru: More than half of internet users live in Rural India.

Rural India had 442 million active internet users last year surpassing urban India which had 378 million users, showed a report by the Internet and Mobile Association of India and marketing data and analytics company Kantar.

In 2023, India had 821 million internet users compared to 759 million in the year before. Rural India witnessed a growth of 78% in the last one year, with shared device usage for internet access higher there than in urban India.


The report said that 90% of internet users surf the internet daily, spending an average of 1.5 hours on the internet. While e-commerce, digital payments and online learning are urban-centric activities, others like OTT, communication, social media, and online gaming are more democrati-

sed. When shopping online, only 26% of Indians avail cash on delivery to make payments as most others use digital modes of payment. Nearly 71% of digital payment users live in urban India.

The report showed 86% of internet users or 707 million people signed up for OTT audio and video services — the top use case for internet in India. About 76% use the internet for communication, 70% for social media and 53% for online gaming, the report showed. Over 80% of OTT users have used music streaming apps in the

last year Subscription to music streaming services is recording 8% growth.

Harsh Jain, chairman of IAMAI and co-founder of Dream Sports, said the report covered over 90,000 households across all states and union territories, and is dubbed as the most comprehensive survey of internet usage in India.

The rise of digital entertainment services is also bolstered by the rise of non-traditional devices (smart TV, smart speakers, fire stick and Chromecast) that have witnessed a growth of 58%
