Clinch hostage deal, end Gaza war: Kamala to Netanyahu

WASHINGTON, July 26 (AP)

VICE PRESIDENT Ramaia Harris on Thursday said she urged Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu to reach a cease-fire deal soon with Hamas so that dozens of hostages held by the militants in Gaza since October 7 can return home.

Harris said she had a "frank and constructive" conversation with Netanyahu in which she affirmed Israel's right to defend itself but also expressed deep concern about the high death toll in Gaza over nine months of war and the "dire" humanitarian situation there.

With all eyes on the likely Democratic nominee. Harris largely reiterated Biden's long-standing message that it's time find an endgame to the brutal war in Gaza, where more than 39,000 Palestinians have died. Yet, she offered a more forceful tone about the urgency of the moment just one day after Netanyahu gave a fiery speech to Congress in which he defended the war, vowed "total victory" against Hamas and made relatively scant mention of cease-fire negotiations.

"There has been hopeful movement in the talks to secure an agreement on this deal," Harris told reporters shortly after meeting with Netanyahu. "And as I just told Prime Minister Netanyahu, it is time to get this deal done."

Netanyahu met separately earlier in the day with President Joe Biden, who has also been calling on Israel and Hamas to come to an agreement on a US-backed, three-phase deal to bring home remaining hostages and establish an extended cease-fire.

Harris said following her meeting with Netanyahu that Israel's war in Gaza is more complicated than simply about people being supportive of one side or the other.

Jaishankar meets Lavrov; discusses bilateral ties

nfortunately, such a sensitive issue related to national security has been made a subject of politics by some. They are the same people who weakened our armed forces by committing scams worth thousands of crores. They are the ones who did not want IAF to get modern fighter jets (Rafales). They had also made preparations to lock the (indigenous) Tejas fighter in a box. PM Modi said, taking a swipe at the previous UPA govt by recalling that Army lacked bulletproof jackets before he took over and the UPA govt allocated Rs 500 crore for one rank-one pension scheme.

"By then, I would be 105. Why would govt take a decision for it today & face abuse? We could have left that for the govts in the future. But we respected this decision taken by

the forces because for us, the security of the country is paramount, not party or politics."

"The truth is that the Agnipath scheme will increase the country's strength and the country will also get capable youth. Announcements have earlier been made about giving priority (in jobs) to Agniveers in the private sector and paramilitary forces."

He said those "misleading" the youth today had no regard for the armed forces in the past. In this context, he cited his govt's implementation of the "one rank, one pension (OROP)" scheme, under which ex-servicemen have been given more than Rs 1.2 lakh crore till now, and the construction of the national war memorial.

On need to upgrade military technologies amid ongoing geopolitical flux, he said armed forces not only need latest weapons & equipment, but also "a modern working style and arrangements". "In the last 10 years, defence reforms have been prioritised, making our forces more capable and self-reliant," he said.

A major stake in defence procurements is now being given to the Indian defence industry, while 25% of the defence R&D has also been reserved for the private sector. "As a result of these efforts, India's annual defence production has crossed the Rs 1.2 lakh crore-mark," the PM said.

"In the past, India was counted only as an arms importer, but now it is making its mark as an arms exporter," he added, expressing happiness that armed forces have decided to stop importing over 5,000 defence products & items.

Agniveers will be 'very useful' for ITBP: DG

NEW DELHI, July 26 (PTI)

AGNIVEERS will prove to be "veryuseful" for the ITBP, which guards the Line of Actual Control between India and China, its top officer said on Friday.

All preparations have been made for the recruitment of these "well-trained and disciplined" soldiers, who will join the border force from the Army, Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) Director General (DG) Rahul Rasgotra said in a video message posted by the Union Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) on its X handle.

As it is known, he said, the ITBP and Army personnel guard the India-China front and hence "these well-trained and disciplined Agniveers will

prove to be very useful for the force".

The DG aid the force "believes that he join g of Agniveers will provide a new energy to the ITBP and the force will benefit from them".

The required amendment in the recruitment rules of the ITBP for inducting Agniveers has been issued by the MHA and they will be eligible for age and physical efficiency test relaxation, Rasgotra said.

The statement comes at a time when there is fresh spotlight on the Agnipath recruitment scheme for short-terminduction of personnel in the Army, Navy and the Air Force.

The government introduced the Agnipath recruitment scheme in 2022 with an aim to being down the age profile of the three services.

The scheme provides for recruiting as Agniveers youngsters between the age group of 17-and-a-half and 21 for a block period of four years with a provision to retain 25 per cent of them for another 15 years.

Several opposition parties, including the Congress, have been targeting the government over the scheme, raising questions about what would happentothe remaining 75 per cent of Agniveers after the end of their four-year tenure.

The about 90,000 personnel ITBP is primarily tasked with guarding the 3,488-kilometrelong Line of Actual Control (LAC) with China, apart from rendering a variety of internal security duties.

Agniveers to get reservation in Govt jobs in U'khand: CM

DEHRADUN, July 26 (PTI)

AGNIVEERS will be granted quota in Government jobs in Uttarakhand upon their return after serving in the Armed Forces, Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami announced on Friday. Addressing a programme here to pay tributes to the Armed Fforces personnel who fought valiantly in extremely harsh conditions, Dhami said legislation will be brought to extend the reservation.

"We will make provisions

and bring an Act to give reservation to them in government services. We are working on this plan. We will make use of their skills and discipline in Government departments," he said. The CM also announced that the aid extended to the kin of martyrs will be increased from Rs 10 lakh to Rs 50 lakh. "No sacrifice can be bigger than the act of laying down one's life to secure the country's borders. No grant or honour can be enough for this supreme sacrifice," he added.
