Ukraine has used US weapons to hit inside Russia: Western official

Washington: Ukraine has used US weapons to strike inside Russia in recent days, according to a Western official familiar with the matter. The weapons were used under recently approved guidance from President Joe Biden allowing American arms to be used to strike inside Russia for the limited purpose of defending Kharkiv, Ukraine's second-largest city. The official was not authorised to comment publicly on the sensitive matter and spoke on condition of anonymity.

Biden's directive allows for US-supplied weapons to be used to strike Russian forces that are attacking or preparing to attack. It does not change US policy that directs Ukraine not to use American-provided ATACMS or long-range missiles and other munitions to strike offensively inside Russia, US officials have said.

Ukrainian officials had stepped up calls on the US to allow Kyiv's forces to defend themselves against attacks originating from Russian territory. Kharkiv sits just 20km from the Russian border and has come under intensified Russian attack.

On Tuesday, White House national security spokesman John Kirby told reporters that he could not confirm that Ukraine had used US weapons at targets in Russia. "We're just not in a position on a day-to-day basis of knowing exactly what the Ukrainians are firing at what. It's certainly at a tactical level." AP



'IIT Bombay, IIT Delhi among top 150 universities in world'

NEW DELHI, June 5 (PTI)

THE Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs) Bombay and Delhi are among the top 150 universities in the world, while the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) retained the top rank globally for the 13th time, according to the QS World University Ranking, 2025 announced on Wednesday.

While IIT Bombay has climbed from 149 last year to 118, up by 31 ranks, IIT Delhi improved its rank by 47

points to bag the 150th position globally.

According to the coveted ranking published by the London-based higher education analyst, Quacquarelli Symonds (QS), Delhi University stood out for the employability of its graduates and has been ranked 44th globally in the category of "employment outcomes."

Boasting 46 universities in this edition of the rankings, the Indian Higher Education system is the seventh most represented globally and the third in Asia, trailing only Japan (49 universities) and China (Mainland) (71 universities). India has one more university within the top 150 rankings, IIT Delhi (150th) and two more entries in the world's top 400 with the University of Delhi (ranked 328th) and Anna University (ranked 383rd) making their debut in this tier.

Syrian opens fire on US mission in Lebanon, arrested

Beirut: An attacker opened fire on the US Embassy in Lebanon Wednesday and was shot and captured by Lebanese security forces, adding to mounting tensions in a crisis-hit nation already on edge over months of cross-border strikes between Israel and the armed militant group Hezbollah. The embassy said a security guard had been wounded during the attack, without specifying how or whether the injuries were serious.

The motive of the shooter, whom the Lebanese army identified as a Syrian citizen and said was being treated at a hospital, was not immediately clear. Lebanese security forces later detained a second man on suspicion of involvement in the attack, Lebanon's staterun news agency said. NYT
