## 'Chinese drones spotted along IB in Himachal'

SHIMLA, Oct 7 (PTI)

DRONES have been spotted along the Indo-China border in Himachal Pradesh's Kinnaur district and they are likely being used for surveillance and espionage purposes, State Minister Jagat Singh Negi said on Monday.

Speaking to PTI, Negi said drone activity has been noticed in Shipki La and Rishi Dogri villages in Poo block of the district.

"Multiple drones frequently flying near the border area have been spotted in the past week and several people have informed me about such sightings," Negi, the MLA from Kinnaur assembly constituency, said.

### Hope more Indian tourists visit Maldives: Muizzu

NEW DELHI, Oct 7 (PTI)

MALDIVIAN President Mohamed Muizzu on Monday said India is one of the largest tourism source markets for the Maldives, and hoped that more Indian tourists will visit the archipelago nation.

In a press briefing after holding "extensive" talks with Prime Minister Narendra Modi at the Hyderabad House here, Muizzu also said the ties between the Maldives and India are "centuries-old, as evident throughout our histories", "Our peopleto-people connections have long been the foundations of the relationship between India and the Maldives. Many Maldivians travel to India for tourism, for medical purposes, education, and for many

other reasons," he said.

At the same time, the Maldives hosts a large number of Indians who contribute the development of the Maldives, wistly president said. "India is one of our largest tourism source markets, and we hope to welcome more Indian tourists to the Maldives, allowing for shared growth and understanding between our peoples," Muizzu said.

Hisremarksduring his ongoing India visit assumes significance as in January this year, a 'Boycott Maldives' online campaign had picked up traction after a few Maldivian ministers had made some allegedlyderogatory comments on PM Modi. Many Indians, including celebrities, had taken to social media platforms urging tourist to instead choose scenisites in places such as Lakshadweep in India instead of the Maldives. However, this first bilateral visit to India by Muizzu since he won the presidential election last year on the 'India out' campaign, seeks to reset ties which earlier had hit a rocky patch. Muizzu last year had asked New Delhi to withdraw its military personnel posted in the archipelago nation by May this year.

The ties between India and the Maldives came under severe strain since Muizzu, known for his pro-China leanings, tookcharge in November. The Maldivian President accompanied by First Lady Madam Sajidha Mohamed and a Maldivian delegation arrived in India on Sunday evening.

#### J P Nadda meets Maldives President



# India, UAE to set up food corridor at USD 2 bn investment: Piyush Goyal

MUMBAI, Oct 7 (PTI)

INDIA and the UAE will set up a food corridor with an expected investment of USD 2 billion which will cater to the UAE mar-



ket and beyond and help Indian farmers earn higher income and create more jobs, UnionMinister Piyush Goyal said on Monday.

Addressing a press conference on the 12th meeting of India-UAE High-Level Task

Force on Investment here, Goyal, who is the Minister for Commerce and Industry, said that a small working group comprising Central Government, State governments involved and the UAE has also been set up to take forward the establishment of food corridor between the two countries on a mission mode basis.

"Another area which was discussed in great detail was the setting up of food parks in India. The background work is largely completed, (this is) another area which will help farmers with higher income, provide jobs in food processing to thousands if not lakhs of our youth and will also ensure the food security of UAE," Goyal said.

The minister said that approximately

USD 2 billion dollars is the initial commitment that UAE has made to invest in the food processing industry and the food park logistics that can be required to move the material to the UAE. "We have set up a small working group of Central Government and State governments involved and the UAE to take forward this establishment of a food corridor between the two countries on a mission mode basis." he stated.

Stating that this investment is expected to happen in the next two-and-a-halfyear period, Goyal said, "But the overall investment is also a factor of the opportunities that Indian businesses are able to offer." "It has been under discussion for a very long time that the UAE would like to invest in setting up food processing facilities in India to enable the availability of high-quality products suitable to the UAE, using Indian farmers' products and to be sold in the UAE. This matter has been under discussion for quite some time with the UAE Government coming, and with different states in India," Goyal said.

"Now, we are looking at progressing themfaster to make sure that investments in food processing can come up in India with UAE investors and the UAE market along with other Gulf markets," he added.


# Nadda elected Chairperson of 77th Session of WHO South East Asia Regional Committee
