NEW CHAPTER: Peace, normalcy begin in Manipur: CM

IMPHAL, Dec 2 (PTI)

MANIPUR Chief Minister N Biren Singh on Saturday said that a new chapter heralding peace and normalcyhas begun in the State with the recent signing of a peace agreement between the Centre and the State's oldest militant outfit United National Liberation Front (UNLF). The peace agreement was signed in New Delhi on Wednesday, ending a six-decade long armed struggle involving the outfit.

Speaking at the reception programme of the UNLF cadres, the CM said, "Iam really happy... A new chapter has begun to usher in peace and bring unity in Manipur."

the same effort, encouragement and support they provided to the UNLF for joining the peace talks, to other groups as well," Singh said. The Chief Minister said pre-

The Chief Minister said precious lives of civilians, insurgents and police personnel have been lost in the decadeslong insurgency in the state.

"Due to violence, several key people have lost their lives. Because of the policy of previous governments that encouraged killings as the only solution instead of engaging in peacetalks, 2,000 valuable lives have been lost. The life of every individual, be that of an insurgent, a civilian or a police personnel, is precious," Singh said.

He said that the process of the peace agreement with UNLF had started three years ago. "Without the support of the people of Manipur, this peace deal would not have materialised. I thank the UNLF and its armed wing MPA for agreeing to sign the pact," the CM said. Singh said, "99 percent of the people of Manipur are happy with the signing of the deal,' and urged the "remaining one per cent" to be part of the celebrations and not criticise the pact.

"Instead of engaging in politics, let us encourage all to work for the welfare of both the country and the state," he said.

Singh appealed to the UNLF to play a responsible role in the current crisis of the state and help bring unity among the people.

Aditya-L1's solar wind particle experiment payload begins op

BENGALURU, Dec 2 (PTI)

THE Aditya Solar wind Particle Experiment payload onboard India's Aditya-L1 satellite has commenced its operations and is performing normally, ISRO

said on Saturday.

ISRO's Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV-C57) September 2 had successfully launched the Aditya-L1 spacecraft, from the second launch pad of Satish Dhawan Space Centre, Sriharikota.

Aditya-L1 is the first Indian space-based observatory to study the Sun from a halo orbit around first Sun-earth Lagrangian point (L1), which is located roughly 1.5 million km from Earth.

In a statement, ISRO said Aditya Solar wind Particle Experiment (ASPEX) comprises two cutting-edge instruments 'the Solar Wind Ion



Spectrometer (SWIS) and SupraThermal and Energetic Particle Spectrometer (STEPS).

The STEPS instrument was operational on September 10, 2023. The SWIS instrument was activated on November 2, 2023, and has exhibited optimal performance. "SWIS, utilising two sensor units with a remarkable 360° field of view each, operates in planes perpendicular to one another," the statement read. According to ISRO, the instrument has successfully measured solar wind ions, primarily protons and alpha particles. A sample energy histogram acquired from one of the sensors over two days in November 2023 illustrates variations in proton and alpha particle (doubly ionized helium, He2+) counts, the agency said.

"These variations were recorded with nominal integration time, providing a comprehensive snapshot of solar wind behaviour," ISRO said.

The directional capabilities of SWIS enable precise measurements of solar wind protons and alphas, contributing significantly to addressing longstanding questions about solar wind properties, underlying processes, and their impact on Earth, the space agency explained.

"The change in the proton and alpha particle number ratio, as observed by SWIS, holds the potential to provide indirect information about the arrival of Coronal Mass Ejections (CMEs) at the Sun-Earth Lagrange Point L1," ISRO said. Enhanced alpha-to-proton ratio is often regarded as one of the sensitive markers of the passage of interplanetary coronal mass ejections (ICMEs) at the L1 and hence considered crucial for space weather studies.

'India should exit global health body'

EMINENT British-Indian Cardiologist Dr Aseen Malhotra has alleged that the World Health Organisation (WHO) has completely lost its independence and suggested that the Indian Government should ignore its advice on various issues and exit the global health body.

Talking to PTI, Malhotra, who gave a lecture at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) here on "The Corporate Capture of Medicine and Public Health" recently, also claimed that regulators do not independently evaluate data related to drugs.

"Drug regulators, such as the FDA, who are supposed to evaluate drugs, receive 65 per cent of their funding from big pharma. The regulator in the box gets 86 per cent funding from the pharma companies. So this is a gross conflict of interest. Patients and doctors think these organisations are independently evaluating the data, but they are not doing that. Till we remove these commercial conflicts of interest from health policies and decision making, we are not going to progress," Malhotra said.

As for the WHO, Malhotra said the organisation has completely lost its independence.

"Seventy per cent of the funding of the World Health Organisation comes from commercial entities.... As long as the WHO is getting industry funding or funding from vested interests, it should not be considered independent and the Indian Government should

ignore its advice. Those commercial entities are not interested in your health, they will make money by deception," he said.

The WHO should be independently funded, otherwise governments, doctors and the public cannot have confidence that their recommendations are based on the best available evidence, Malhotra said.

Medical knowledge is under commercial control but most doctors do not know that, he said, adding, "What that means is that the information doctors use to make decisions for patients, specifically when it comes to drug prescription, has been biased and corrupted by big pharma whose only interest is to produce profit for the shareholders and not to give you the best treatment."

3 anti-submarine warfare ships launched at Cochin Shipyard

KOCHI, Dec 2 (ANI)

THE first three ships in the series of eight Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Crafts (ASW SWC) built by Cochin Shipyard for the Indian Navy were launched.

The three ships were launched after completion of initial construction work. These ships will be equipped with advanced underwater weaponsandsensors, and over 80 per cent indigenous content, Cochin Shipyard Limited said in press note.

The first three ships in this

The first three ships in this series, CSLYard nos BY 523, BY 524 & BY 525 shall bear the name 'INS MAHE, INS MAL-VAN and INS MANGROL' upon



commissioning into the Indian Navy. The vessel are 78.0 m long, 11.36 m wide with a draught of about 2.7 m. The displacement is about 896 tons, with a maximum speed of 2.8 knots and endurance of 1800 nautical mikes, it added.

The vessels are designed to fit indigenously developed, state-of-the-art SONARS, for underwater surveillance. Concurrent launching of the three ships is yet another milestone archievement for Cochin Shipyard Ltd. The first ship of the project is planned to be readyfordelivery by November 2024. Despite the crisis of the COVID pandemic and the war in Ukraine, the timely launching of the ships is considered

a great success

After the ceremonial pooja, the first vessel was launched by Anjali Bahl, the second vessel was launched by Kangana Berry, and the third vessel by Zarine Lord Singh.
