Assam floods

situation still critical, toll 52

NEW DELHI, July 6 (PTI)

WATER level in different rivers in Bihar started rising at many places and the flood situation in Assam remained critical with 24.5 lakh people in 30 districts affected as torrential rain battered eastern parts India.

Union Home Minister Amit Shah spoke to Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma to take stock of the flood situation and said the National Disaster Response Force and the State Disaster Response Force were working on a war footing to rescue and provide relief to the affected people.

Thirteen people were killed in rain-related incidents across Uttar Pradesh the in the last 24 hours, State's relief department officials said.

Assam has been reeling from floods, with more than 24.5 lakh people affected in 30 districts and major rivers flowing above the danger level at several places. Cachar, Kamrup, Dhubri, Nagaon, Goalpara, Barpeta, Dibrugarh,

Bongaigaon, Lakhimpur, Jorhat, Kokrajhar, Karimganj, and Tinsukia are among the

districts affected.

Flood in urban areas of three districts of Kamrup (Metropolitan), Kamrup and Dibrugarh was also reported.

So far, 52 people have been killed in this year's flood while 12 others were killed in landslides and storms.

The Brahmaputra river is flowing above the danger mark in Nimatighat, Guwahati, Goalpara and Dhubri.

The Barak river is flowing above the danger mark in AP Ghat, BP Ghat, Chota Bakra and Fuletral, and its tributaries Dhaleswari in Gharmura, Katakhal in Matizuri and Kushiyara in Karimganj town. The devastating flood in the Kaziranga National Park has

Kaziranga National Park has claimed 114 wild animals while 95 were rescued till Saturday.

In Bihar, light to moderate rain was recorded in many districts since July 4, according to the latest rainfall bulletin issued by the water resources department.

India donates digital equipment worth Rs 300 mn to 200 schools in Sri Lanka

COLOMBO, July 6 (PTI)

DESCRIBING it as "a project for posterity," India on Saturday donated digital equipment, including 2,000 Tabs, worth Rs 300 million for use by 200 schools in the southern province of Sri Lanka.

A ceremony in the southern district of Galle, attended by President Ranil Wickremesinghe and Indian High Commissioner Santosh Jha, marked a significant step towards educational modernisation, with the provision of 200 Smart Classrooms and 2,000Tabs to 200 schools in the

Southern rovince.

"Enlowing a request by the Minister of Health and Industry, Dr Ramesh Pathirana, the Government of India allocated Rs 300 million to the Southern Provincial Council for this project. Of the 200 selected schools, 150 are in the Galle district, while the remaining 50 are in the Hambantota and Matara districts," a statement from the President's Media Division (PMD) said.

Additionally, 2,000 Tabswere distributed, with each of the 200 classrooms receiving 10 Tabs, the statement said.

"We deeply appreciate the

support extended by neighbouring India in advancing modern technology. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has expressed interest in establishing an Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) campus in Sri Lanka, which is highly appreciated," Wickremesinghe said. "Additionally, negotiations to enhance cooperation in the energy sector with India are progressing successfully," he said.

Pathirana and Minister of Education Dr Susil Premajayantha, both appreciated India's assistance in their respective speeches.

Masoud Pezeshkian elected Iran President

 Pezeshkian gets 16.3 million votes against his rival Saeed Jalili's 13.5 million votes

DUBAI, July 6 (AP)

REFORMIST candidate Masoud Pezeshkian won Iran's runoff presidential electionon Saturday, besting hard-liner Saeed Jalili by promising to reach out to the West and ease enforcement on the country's mandatory heads carflaw after years of sanctions and protests squeezing the Islamic Republic.

Pezeshkian promised no radical changes to Iran's Shiite theocracy in his campaign and long has held Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei as the final arbiter of all matters of state in the country. But even Pezeshkian's modest aims will

be challenged by an Iranian Government still largely held by hard-liners, the ongoing Israel-Hamas war in the Gaza Strip, and Western fears over Tehran enriching uranium to near-weapons-grade levels.

A vote count offered by authorities put Pezeshkian as the winner with 16.3 million votes to Jalili's 13.5 million in Friday's election. Overall, Iran's Interior Ministry said 30 million people voted in an election held without internationally recognised monitors.

Supporters of Pezeshkian, a heart surgeon and long-time lawmaker, entered the streets of Tehran and other cities before dawn to celebrate as his lead grew over Jalili, a hardline former nuclear negotiator.

"Dear people of Iran, the elections are over and this is just the beginning of our cooperation," Pezeshkian wrote on the social platform X, still banned in Iran.

"The difficult path ahead will not be smooth except with your companionship, empathy and trust. I extend my hand to you and I swear on my honour that I will not leave you alone on this path. Do not leave me alone."

Pezeshkian's win still sees Iran at a delicate moment, with tensions high in the Mideast over the Israel-Hamas war, Iran's advancing nuclear programme, and a looming election in the United States that could put any chance of a detente between Tehran and Washington at risk. Pezeshkian's victory also wasn't arout of Jalili, meaning he'll have to carefully navigate Iran's internal politics as the doctor hasnever held a sensitive, highlevel security post.

The first round of voting on June 28 saw the lowest turnout in the history of the Islamic Republicsince the 1979 Islamic Revolution. Iranian officials have long pointed to turnout as a sign of support for the country's Shiite theocracy, which has been under strain after years of sanctions crushing Iran's economy, mass demonstrations and intense crackdowns on all dissent.

India unveils light tank 'Zorawar' DRDO chief reviews advanced trials

HAJIRA, July 6 (ANI)

IN A major boost to Indian forces deployed oppositeChina in Ladakh, premier defence research agency Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and private sector firm Larsen and Toubro (L&T) are at advanced stage of trials of the indigenous Light Tank 'Zorawar'.

DRDO chief Dr Samir V Kamat today reviewed the progress made in the project at the Larsen and Toubro plant at Hajira in Gujarat.

Developed in a record time of two years for high altitude areas of Ladakh, the tank is testimony to Indian progress in indigenous manufacturing.

The DRDO and L&T have integrated USVs in loitering munitions in the tank learning lessons from the Russia and Ukraine conflict.

The light tank 'Zorawar' with 25 tonnes in weight and it is the first time, a fresh tank has been designed and made ready for trials in such a short time. 59 of these tanks will be provided to the Army initially and it will be a front runner for the major programme of 295 more of these

amoured vehicles.

The Indian Air Force can supply two tanks at a time in the C-17 class transport aircraft as the tank is light and can be run at high speeds in mountain valleys.

The trials are expected to be completed in the next 12-18 months and be ready for induction. Even though the first ammunition is coming from Belgium, the DRDO is ready to develop the ammunition indigenously.

'ZORAWAR' EXPECTED TO BE INDUCTED INTO INDIAN ARMY BY2027, SAYS KAMAT: DRDO chief Samir V Kamath said on Saturday that 'Zorawar' is expected to be inducted into the Indian Army by the year 2027 after all trials. The DRDO chief told ANI, "It's indeed a momentous day for all of us to see the light tank in action. It makes me happy and proud. It's indeed an example.

In a short period of two years to two and a half years, we have not only designed this tank but made a first prototype and now the first prototype will undergo development trials over the next six months, and then we will be ready to offer it to our users for user trials.
