Turkey to submit request to join genocide case against Israel in UN court

ANKARA, Aug 7 (AP)

TURKIYE will file a request with a United Nations court on Wednesday to join South Africa's genocide lawsuit against Israel.

The declaration of intervention will be submitted at the International Court of Justice in The Hague, the official said on condition of anonymity in accordance with regulations.

Turkiye, one of the fiercest critics of Israel's actions in Gaza, will become the latest nation to seek to participate in the case. Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan has frequently compared Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu to Adolf Hitler, accused his country of genocide, called for it to be punished in international courts and criticised Western nations for backing Israel.

In May, Turkey suspended trade with Israel, citing its assault on Gaza. In contrast to Westernnations that have designated Hamas as a terrorist organisation, Erdogan has commended the group, calling it a liberation movement.

South Africa brought a case to the International Court of Justice late last year.

China, Saudi, UAE agree to roll ever cash-strapped Pakistan's USD 12 billion debt for one year

ISLAMABAD, Aug 7 (PTI)

CHINA, Saudi Arabia and the UAE have agreed to roll over cash-strapped Pakistan's USD 12 billion debt for one year, as the International Monetary Fund (IMF) is likely to approve its USD 7 billion bailout package later this month.

After a meeting of the Senate Standing Committee Finance on Tuesday, Finance Muhammad Aurangzeb told reporters that there was no delay in the IMF Executive Board meeting, which is going to take place by the end of this month to approve the USD 7 billion Extended Fund Facility, the Express Tribune reported on Wednesday.

The Executive Board is scheduled to meet on August 28 to approve the USD 7 billion package, the report said,

quoting Government officials. The development marks an end to the uncertainty over the timing of the Executive Board meeting, which was contingent upon the rollover of debts by Pakistan's three traditional creditors, it said.

Aurangzeb said the USD 12 billion cash deposits by China, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates would be rolled overforone year, like last time. Earlier, he had said that the IMF had asked for the rollover for three to five years before the Executive Board meeting.

However, he clarified that the requirement was to secure the rollover for one year but the Government was trying to have these rollovers for three to five vears. He added that the three bilateral creditors had agreed to roll the loans over on the existing terms and conditions.

The IMF announced a stafflevel agreement for USD 7 billion last month subject to the approval of the Executive Board and securing financing commitments from the bilateral and multilateral creditors.

The Finance Minister said there was no point in asking for an increase in the interest rates on these loans when the country's foreign exchange reserves had strengthened compared to a year ago. The IMF, he added, had identified only a USD 3-5 billion financing gap over the three-year programme period, which was quite manageable.

"Pakistan has also received an offer from a foreign commercial bank but we are waiting for the IMF Board approval to ask the lender to cut the offered interest rates," said Aurangzeb. The offer had come from a non-Gulf and non-Chinese commercial bank, he added, without disclosing the

name.

Rajpaksas announce heir as candidate for Lanka presidency

COLOMBO, Aug 7 (PTI)

NAMAL Rajapaksa, the 38year-old heir to the Rajapaksa dynasty, was on Wednesday named as the SLPP candidate for the presidential election, thus officially ending Rajapaksa family's backing to the incumbent Ranil Wickremesinghe.

Sagara Kariyawasam, the General Secretary of the Sri LankaPeople's Front (SLPP, also known locally by its popular Sinhalese name, Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna), announced the younger Rajapaksa's candidacy early on Wednesday morning at a ceremony at the party headquarters. Namal's entry has made the election a four-cornered contest. Besides, President Wickremesinghe, the main Opposition leader Sajith Premadasa and the Marxist JVP leader Anura Kumara Dissanayake are already in the fray.

The Rajapaksas - Mahinda, Basil and Gotabaya - were instrumental in Wickremesinghe winning the parliamentary vote in July 2022 to take over Gotabaya's remaining term. It was soon after the unprecedented development of mid-April 2022 when the island nation declared its first-ever sovereign default since gaining independence from Britain in 1948 and almost civil war-like conditions followed as unrest spread amid locals over inflation and other economic stress that had led to Gotabaya's ouster.

Wednesday's development comes days after the SLPP lost nearly 100 of its MPs to Wickremesinghe after he announced his candidature as an independent.

Mumbai: The political crisis in Bangladesh, which has taken a violent turn throwing normal life out of gear, has impacted Indian companies operating in the country.

FMCG company Marico's manufacturing operations in Bangladesh remain shut even as it claimed that a large majority of its retail sales force and distributors have now resumed operations. Marico which gets 44% of its international business and about 12% of its consolidated revenues from the country runs three factories in Bangladesh's Gazipur and Chattogram regions.

"The operating conditions in the market are gradually improving, however we remain watchful of the evolving situation....we expect our manufacturing operations to resume soon while we continue to maintain an adequate assurance of supply of our products to meet market demand in the interim," Marico said in a stock exchange filing on Wednesday, adding that the medium term prospects of its business in Bangladesh remains intact. The company sells a range of products including shampoos, edible oil, baby care and skin

Democrats pitch Harris-Watz team as 'ticket of joy' for US

Hope It Will Open Doors For Kamala To White Votes, Blue Wall States

Washington: He taught in China, knows Mandarin, and is "therefore cozy with China". He was arrested for drunk driving. He quit the National Guard just before deployment in Iraq. He was governor of Minnesota during the Minneapolis riots. He's an uber-liberal west coast wannabe. MAGA Republicans are bombarding Kamala Harris' vice-presidential pick Tim Walz with political dirt within hours of him coming into the national limelight even as the new Democratic ticket is surging ahead in polls, the new energy and momentum evident at a raucous rally in Philadelphia, often referred to as the City of Brotherly Love.

Indeed, brotherly love was what was on display on Tuesday as Democrats quickly closed ranks, with Pennsylvania governor Josh Shapiro, who lost the intra-party race to be Harris' running mate, joining the event to endorse the Harris-Walz ticket even as Americans began scouring for information about a man who one survey showed 71% of respondents had never heard of.

What they are discovering is a high-relatable everyone's uncle whose folksy style and openhearted mannerism reportedly charmed Harris so much that she is risking losing Pennsylvania by picking him over Shapiro. Among the more endearing disclosures he reportedly made to Harris when he was being vetted: He had never used a teleprompter before.

Their pairing is now being presented to voters as a "ticket of joy", in contrast to the dark and dystopian view of America that Donald Trump is projecting if he loses. "Thank you...for

What Walz brings to the table, according to Democratic strategists, is a broader appeal to white rural and suburban voters who remain leery of the first woman of colour nominated for the White House race by a major party. Party panjandrums are hoping that even if he swings 1 or 2% of white voters in the so-called Blue Wall states that are won or lost narrowly, including neighbouring Wisconsin, Michigan and Pennsylvania, it will pave way for Harris to reach the 270 electoral votes needed to win the prez race.

Whether that will work in practice is yet to be tested since traditionally, outside of the optics, the vice-presidential choice is inconsequential in drawing votes, something Republican candidate Donald Trump also stated last week in reference to his own running mate. Trump supporters meanwhile are already sowing fears about Walz's liberal policies, including generating memes ridiculing him as "Tampon Tim" because his administration provides free menstrual products to students in Minnesota publicschools. But Walzis unapologetic about his policies that incodifying abortion rights and free school meals for children. Questioned about this in one interview, Walz joked about himself, "What a monster! Kids are eating and having full bellies so they can go learn, and women are making their own healthcare decisions!"

Every bit of Walz mid-western charm was evident at the boisterous rally where he was introduced to a partisan crowd whose own governor was disdained, but which still enjoyed the Minnesotan's verbal salvos, including a risque shot at his rival JD Vance, also from heartland America, asking him to "get off the couch and show up" to debate him. The salty aside was a reference to the liberal canard online about Vance fornicating with a sofa, one of several such lurid memes and themes both sides are generating in an election campaign that is increasingly going below the belt.

Dhaka: Bangladesh, lumbering through chaos, confusion and violence for three days, will get an interim gove Thursday with Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus at the helm, marking a homecoming for the self-exiled 84-year-old former "banker to the poor" after years of battling corruption and other cases slapped by the erstwhile Sheikh Hasina administration.

On Wednesday, a Bangladesh court overturned Yunus's conviction in a case relating to labour law violations. Yunus was out on bail after being handed a 6-month jail sentence in January.
